## Rural Municipality of Loon Lake No. 561

## BYLAW No. 4-2023

## A BYLAW TO REGULATE THE SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Loon Lake No. 561 in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts as follows:

- In this bylaw "road" means any public highway within the municipality as defined in *The Highways and Transportation Act*, 1997, other than a Provincial Highway as designated to such Act.
- 2. "Vehicle" shall mean a vehicle, trailer or semi-trailer or tractor or a motor vehicle as ascribed to by *The Traffic Safety Act*.
- 3. Signs indicating the maximum speed allowed shall be erected at the commencement of the speed zone area and signs shall be erected showing the end of the speed zone area.
- 4. The maximum speed allowed on a particular road are as follows:
  - i) No person shall operate a vehicle at a greater speed than 30 kilometers per hour on the following roads:
    - Roads within the Hamlet of Little Fishing Lake.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Jumbo Beach.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Makwa Lake.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Pine Cove.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Peck Lake.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Christie Developments.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Rippling Waters Estates.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Fire Song.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Fowler Lake Developments.
    - Roads within the subdivision of Ministikwan.
  - ii) No person shall operate a vehicle at a greater speed than 50 kilometers per hour on the following roads:
    - From the west boundary of the Village of Loon Lake north westerly on Primary Grid No. 699 to the north boundary of section 22-58-22 W, approximately 2.5 kilometers.
- 5. Any person who violates any provision of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to the penalties in the General Penalty Bylaw of the municipality.
- 6. Bylaws No. 7/2015 are hereby repealed.
